A Woman’s Work...

Fair Trade seeks to provide market access to the most marginalized communities around the world, including women. “Women farmers grow, buy, sell, cook food and feed their children. They perform the majority of the agricultural work and, on a global scale, women cultivate more than half of all the food that is grown,” said Yukiko Omura, of the International Fund for Agricultural Development. Women around the world spend at least twice as much time as men on unpaid activities, work longer hours in worse jobs and yet still earn less than men for the same work, according to the International Labor Organization. However, women are more likely to share their economic gains with their families and communities. When women are members of a Fair Trade cooperative they can gain access to training, education, leadership roles and health care. By contributing to the economic security of their families and communities they also often gain social standing.

- Farmers' markets, fairs, concerts, and other gatherings provide opportunities to sell coffee, tea, chocolate and snacks while building community and publicizing your group's social justice and mission work.
- Sell or auction baskets at an event kickoff, festival, or for the holidays. Create theme baskets—for example put some Organic Mind, Body & Soul Coffee, Organic Spicy Hot Cocoa, Organic Dried Sweetened Cranberries, and our Organic Panama Dark Chocolate in a basket and you have the perfect Valentine's Day gift! Or create a "green" basket with Organic Love Buzz Coffee, Organic Green Tea, Organic Mint Chocolate Bars, and our Organic Tamari Roasted Almonds.
- Start a Buying Club. Find out what community members would like to buy, tally the orders, and buy the products wholesale.
- Host a Family Coffee House. Your youth group or other groups can ask members to sign up to play music, read poetry, or hold a talent show where you sell fairly traded coffee, tea, and cocoa by the cup. Sell baked goods made with our Organic Unsweetened Baking Cocoa, and Organic Dried Sweetened Cranberries while you promote Fair Trade.
